Before filming	
To complete the script, it has to (divide) into scenes, and

Then the outline (expand) into a script.	
After the script (complete), a director must	
(hire).	
During and after filming	
The final film you see on the screen (create) by the	
director and editor out of thousands of different shots.	
Soon after the film has been edited, music (compose)	
and sound effects may (add).	
After the filming (finish), the different shots can then (put together) by the editor and director.

Once shooting begins, different shots (film) separately.	
Scenes may (not shoot) in sequences.
